RULES FOR THE COMBINATION OF SUBJECTS COMPULSORY SUBJECT COMPONENT

GROUP A: COMPULSORY SUBJECTS

1. English Home Language
2. Afrikaans **OR** Xhosa (First Additional Language)
3. Mathematics **OR** Mathematical Literacy
4. Life Orientation

GROUP B: ELECTIVE SUBJECTS:

Learners must **choose three subjects**. Please take note of the following considerations when choosing subjects:

THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION STIPULATIONS

- In order to take **Physical Science**, a learner is required to do Mathematics. *Should a change from Mathematics to Mathematical Literacy, and the learner takes Physical Science, the learner will have to change from Physical Science to a subject that does not have Mathematics as a prerequisite.*

HUDSON PARK HIGH SCHOOL REQUIREMENTS

Once subject choices have been made the subject heads will follow up with requirements. Please take note of these requirements below:

1. If a learner would like to choose **Visual Arts or Music** in grade 10, but did Creative Arts in grades 8 & 9 the following **portfolios/auditions** will be required:
 - **Visual Arts** – interview with Belgravia Art Centre’s Principal
 - portfolio to be submitted by the end of term 3 2025
 - **Music** – audition with the music department
 - Music can still be taken as a *non-subject* (additional fees apply) on condition:
 - there is class space & instrument availability
 - attend an audition with the music department
2. If a learner chooses an **eighth subject** they must ensure the following requirements are met:
 - The learner’s average is **80% or above** for an exam term.
 - The learner’s commitment to
 - work independently as he/she will have very little contact time with the relevant subject teacher.
 - ensure that he/she is aware of all necessary work, tasks, assignments, test and examination dates.
 - The following subjects can be taken successfully as an eighth subject:
 - History,
 - Business Studies,
 - Music,
 - Visual Art

3. **Class sizes** in certain subjects are limited due to specialised classrooms, namely:
- Consumer Studies
 - Computer Application Technology (CAT)
 - Engineering, Graphics and Design (EGD)
 - Information Technology (IT)
4. The following subject's 2025 **additional costs/levies** (2026 fees subject to change):
- Specialized Art – payable to Belgravia R740 per term
Specialized Music Levy – R 4400
Specialized Instrument Hire – R 3300
Consumer Studies Levy – R550
5. The following subjects have specific **equipment/workbook requirements**. Should a learner choose to take these subjects please ensure that this equipment/workbooks are purchased by the **start of Term 1 2026**. Failure to have the necessary equipment will result in the learner having to change the subject.
- **Accounting**
 - Workbooks can be purchased from the book room at the start of term 1.
 - approximate cost R230
 - **Computer Application Technology (CAT)**
 - Memory stick
 - **Consumer Studies**
 - 40cm toolbox that can be locked
 - Appendix B includes the list of equipment required
 - **EGD**
 - Drawing equipment, board, bag – see Appendix B
 - Workbooks (R330 for 2025) that can be purchased from school in Jan 2026
 - **Information Technology (IT),**
 - The learner must have a laptop that is suitable to run the required programs and will be required to be brought to school when instructed by the teacher.
 - The specifications will be given to the relevant learners by the end of term 3 2025.
 - 64GB USB Flash Drive
 - **Physical Science**
 - Workbooks can be purchased from the book room at the start of term 1.
 - approximate cost R450

HUDSON PARK HIGH SCHOOL RECOMMENDATIONS

Hudson Park High School recommends the following:

- **Mathematics:** It is advised that a learner achieves a MINIMUM of **60% for Mathematics** in Grade 9 June examination should they wish to take Mathematics as a subject (Grade 10-12).
- **Mathematical Literacy:** A learner is strongly encouraged to consider Mathematical Literacy if the learner is achieving below **60% in Grade 9 June examination**.
- **Accounting:** It is advised that the learner achieves a MINIMUM of **60% for the Accounting component of the Grade 9 EMS assessments** should they wish to take Accounting as a subject (Grade 10-12).

A learner considering taking Accounting should ideally be achieving at least **60% for Mathematics in Grade 9**.

- **Physical Science:** It is advised that a learner achieves a MINIMUM of **50% for the Physical Science section of Natural Sciences** in the June Examination of Grade 9 should they wish to take Physical Science as a subject (Grade 10-12). The physics & chemistry components are covered in term 2 and 3 of Grade 9 and these tests should be taken into consideration.
- **EGD:** Mathematics is highly recommended. It is advised that learners achieve at least **60% and above for Mathematics** in Grade 9 as the subject requires logical, mathematical ability.
- **Information Technology:** It is advised that a learner achieves a minimum of **60% for Mathematics** in their Grade 9 June examination.
